Travel to Oxford

Oxford is 56 miles (90km) north-west of London, with excellent bus and rail services.

St Hugh's College is located in Oxford city centre and therefore we recommend using public transport where possible, as parking is limited.

There are direct main line services between Oxford, London (Marylebone and Paddington) and Birmingham. There are also coach services from several London locations (The Oxford Tube and X90).

Oxford offers an excellent Park and Ride system, with 5 sites providing excellent access into the city centre by bus. Visit the Park and Ride website for more information.

There is a regular coach service from London Heathrow and Gatwick airports to Oxford city centre. From Heathrow Airport there is a fast train link to London Paddington which connects directly with services to Oxford. Taxis are available at the Gloucester Green Bus Station or from the Oxford Rail Station.

Accommodation

Oxford is a popular destination, and low-cost accommodation is not the easiest to find - *book early*, especially if your budget is limited.

Hotels

- Macdonald Randolph Hotel From ~£190 per night for a double room. On-site parking is available for £28.50 per night (pre-booking necessary).
- Old Parsonage Hotel From ~£185 per night for a double room. (Very) limited on-site parking available.
- Old Bank Hotel From ~£170 per night for a double room. 40 parking spaces available for hotel guests.
- Mercure Oxford Eastgate Hotel From ~£135 per night for a double room. Paid (public) parking space is limited.
- Holiday Inn From ~£135 per night for a double room. There is free on-site parking. There are buses every 10 minutes into town.
- Best Western Linton Lodge Hotel From ~£200 per night for a double room. Free parking on site.
- Cotswold Lodge Hotel from ~£140 per night for a double room.

Budget hotels

- Premier Inn From ~£65 per night for a double room. This hotel is 3 miles from the conference. There is free on-site parking. The bus stop into town is a 10-minute walk away.
- Travelodge From ~£45 per night, depending on location. There are 3 Travelodges around Oxford, situated 2.5-6 miles from the conference. Parking is free/free-but-limited/available but paid, depending on the site. There are buses into town.

Non-hotel options

• Student Rooms – From ~£37 for a single room with shared facilities. Accommodation in University Colleges. Mostly within walking distance from the conference, but there are also plenty of buses. There is usually no parking available.

There are also many small B&B's and Guest houses across Oxford. These are not included here because of the limited number of available rooms, but these can easily be found via regular search engines. Prices start from ~£65 for an ensuite room.
